Svanna Sparrow: 6 males, two females (paired with two males)

Wild Turkey: 2 in meadow Turkey Vulture: 3-4 overhead

Chipping Sparrow: at least 3, all heard, but not seen

Crow: 1

Red-breasted Nuthatch: 1 (near trailer)

Tree Swallows: 3

Ho Chu thinks this is the best property he has yet encountered for the study of Savanna Sparrows. He needs to move into the Wardsville area for about 3 months to complete his study on a daily basis.
