Meanwhile, Jane and Pat were finding a lot of new species and confirming ones already logged. (See below) tarting at the RL and gravel flats, they climbed the bluffs to the top, then climbed down again to the willow bank, then found the RSF trail and followed it up to the HB. From there they descended to the BCF, walking out along the trail. At the trailer, Jane took a GPS reading (436366 4720199).

We all rejoined for a late "lunch," the time already past most people's supper hour. Adjourning to the river, our combined forces observed many species, new and old. All seemed delighted with the late evening ambience, golden sunlight and warmish temperatures.
