She continued on the mouth of Fleming Creek while I went to work on the midstream trestle, essentially rebuilding it. After some dicey moments along the steep bank of Fleming Creek, Pat reported that no other bridge parts remained to be found. However, while searching from the banks, she found some interesting new plants, including a wood fern (unknown species) and a Plantain-leafed sedge, both plants new records for the site. At the RL, she noticed a number of BW and WA doing nicely along the upper bank east of the landing.

Along Edgar's trail at the edge of the LM, Pat spied a new BO nest.
