Erin solved the riddle of the Aspen ants. It turns out there are tiny aphids on the aspen leaves that I failed to see (masked by ants?) and the ants were congregating around the aphids. At the same time, the aphids were concentrating at the softest (and most easily penetrated tissues) in the growing leaves.

We scraped the trail from the log bridge to the bench on the inside bend of FC. We also gave a heavy watering to all the planted trees. On one occasion while I went to load up on water, Erin began labeling volunteers along the GF in preparation for moving next fall/spring.
