Driving in along the Beattie Line, we spotted a dead raccoon by the road. The rear end had been eaten out by a Coyote, probably scavenging.

While Will busied himself carting several wheelbarrow loads of river drift to a pile in the LM, I finished planting the three remaining RO in the RZ. Then we planted the three maples in the BCF (close to the first 100m of trail). We finished off the afternoon mulching some 25-30 saplings in the RZ, including all those planted within the last 8 months. I got a good look at an Eastern Towhee singing on a brach nearby, at one point. At the end of the afternoon I exchanged the card on Cam #1 and took a pond sample.
